

Interrogative Sentences

An interrogative sentence is **a sentence that asks a question**. ASL has two kinds, and your face tells the difference.

The two kinds, side by side

Yes / No questions

EYEBROWS UP

- 1 Raise your eyebrows and widen your eyes
- 2 Lean your head forward
- 3 Hold the last sign in your sentence

WH questions

EYEBROWS DOWN

- 1 Lower your eyebrows
- 2 Lean your head forward
- 3 Hold the last sign, usually the wh-word

WH-WORDS

WHO

WHAT

WHERE

WHY

HOW

WHICH

HOW MANY

HOW MUCH

Example sentences

WH QUESTION

What's your mom's name?

YOUR MOM NAME WHAT?

or

WHAT YOUR MOM NAME WHAT?

YES / NO QUESTION

Do you have allergies?

ALLERGIES YOU HAVE?
