

# ASL Student Assessment Handout

This handout is for you to demonstrate what you remember from last year in ASL. You will complete a few short activities to show your skills in expressive signing, receptive understanding, vocabulary, grammar, and fingerspelling.

## 1. Conversation / Dialogue

Work with a partner. Have a short conversation using ASL. Topics could include: introductions, favorite food, or hobbies.

## 2. Expressive Prompt

Your teacher will give you a picture or topic. Sign about it for 1–2 minutes.

## 3. Vocabulary Spot-Check

Your teacher will show you vocabulary words. Sign each word clearly.

## 4. Fingerspelling

Watch as your teacher fingerspells 10–12 words. Write them down or sign them back.

## 5. Receptive Video Quiz

Watch a short signed video. Answer the comprehension questions your teacher gives you.

## 6. Silent Classroom Warm-Up

For today, try not to use your voice. Use ASL, gestures, or fingerspelling to communicate.

## 7. Grammar Awareness

Your teacher will sign some sentences. Watch carefully — are they correct or incorrect? Be ready to explain.
