

Placement Guide Based on Rubric Scores

Scoring Method

- Rubric has 5 categories (Expressive, Receptive, Vocabulary, Fingerspelling, Grammar).
- Each category is worth **1–4 points**.
- Maximum possible score: 20 points.

0-7 points \rightarrow Beginner (Level 1)

- Student struggles with vocabulary recall and basic communication.
- Limited receptive and expressive skills.
- ASLdeafined Placement: Beginner (start fresh with core signs, fingerspelling, and basic grammar).

8–11 points \rightarrow Intermediate (Level 2)

- Student can understand some basic conversations but with frequent errors.
- Vocabulary knowledge is partial; grammar is inconsistent.
- ASLdeafined Placement: Intermediate (review basics, start expanding sentence structure and vocabulary themes).

12–15 points \rightarrow Advanced (Level 3)

- Student signs with moderate fluency and can follow most conversations.
- Still has occasional grammar/vocabulary gaps.
- ASLdeafined Placement: Advanced (focus on classifiers, story retelling, and cultural context).

16–18 points → Advanced Plus (Level 4)

- Student is confident in both expressive and receptive skills.
- Some small weaknesses in speed, nuance, or complex grammar.
- ASLdeafined Placement: Advanced Plus (emphasize nuanced grammar, cultural readings, idiomatic expressions, and longer discourse).

19–20 points \rightarrow Level 5 (Highest)

- Student demonstrates strong fluency and grammar awareness.
- Understands authentic signing at near-native pace.
- ASLdeafined Placement: Level 5 (advanced discourse, Deaf culture projects, interpreting-like practice, full narratives).
